- نَكرَة Indefinite
- 1. The Definite Noun المَعْرِفَة

Definite nouns indicate a particular thing, place or person.

- The book الكِتَابُ
- مِصْرُ Egypt
- The Zam zam water المَاءُ زم زم

a) A proper noun عَلَم which is the name of a particular person, place or object.









b) A noun which, in virtue of the definite article U the added to it, specifies the object or person.









## 2. The indefinite Noun النَّكِرَةُ

Indefinite nouns do not indicate any particular thing or person, they indicate something in general.

- A student طَالِبٌ
- A school مَدرَسَةٌ
- A city مَدِينَةٌ



Indefinite nouns usually carry tanween.
